*THE NETWORK works with nonprofit organizations to develop volunteer projects that match your interests. These are just some of the types of projects and fields.*

## MANAGEMENT ASSISTANCE

Use your business skills to help a nonprofit develop a new project or expand an existing program. One Network volunteer is advising a nonprofit on a for-profit venture that funds its scholarship program.

### WORKSHOP COORDINATOR

Use your diverse background to develop, assist or present a workshop to the clients or staff of a nonprofit organization. Share an area of legal expertise, a hobby such as music or art, or other skills.

Steer the development and support the valuable work of a nonprofit by joining its board of directors.

### PUBLIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS

Assist with a public education campaign or develop a "know your rights" brochure. One Network volunteer coordinated a national education campaign on First Amendment case law developments.

## FORGING PARTNERSHIPS

The CityBar Public Service Network serves attorneys seeking public interest volunteer work by forging links between the legal and public service communities. Working closely with leading nonprofit organizations, the Network develops innovative legal and nonlegal positions for volunteer attorneys. Network clients range from associates to retired attorneys who volunteer between five and thirty-five hours a week.

## EXPANDING THE POSSIBLE

Network staff help you focus your interests, identify your skills, and consider the range of volunteer possibilities. We have extensive contacts in the nonprofit sector at every level and in every field. This brochure introduces you to just some of the possible volunteer projects. If current Network projects aren't the right fit, we will pursue new nonprofit contacts to develop a project that is. Nonprofits that use Network volunteers provide the necessary training and support to ensure that you will get the most out of your volunteer experience.

## STAY HOME OR HEAD OVERSEAS

While most Network projects are in the New York City area, there are organizations that sponsor volunteers overseas to serve as a business or legal advisor in developing countries and emerging democracies. The Network will help you consider which opportunities are right for you, advise on the application process, and introduce you to attorneys who have volunteered overseas.

## CHALLENGE YOURSELF

Through volunteer service, you have the opportunity to try something new, expand your experience, and gain the satisfaction of giving back to the community. Volunteering can complement any stage of your career: volunteer five hours a week when working full-time or up to thirty five hours during a sabbatical or after retirement. The Network will be a resource for you as you consider public service opportunities and throughout your tenure as a Network volunteer.

## ORAL HISTORIES

Collect stories of an organization's clients or write the history of a group's development. This information can be used for publicity materials and grant proposals.

### PROGRAM EVALUATION

Help an organization evaluate the outcome of a program. One Network volunteer is assessing the impact of a nonprofit's science curriculum piloted in four schools.

## RACIAL JUSTICE

## EDUCATOR OR MENTOR

Teach the law to a young person during or after school. Expose students to the reality of the legal profession and its relevance to everyday life.

## CHILD WELFARE

### POLICY OR LEGAL RESEARCH

Tackle a policy question or research a legal issue that impacts a nonprofit's services. Network volunteers have researched censorship, education and child welfare policy questions.
