This is the earliest item from the press of Benjamin Franklin in the Association's library. It was advertised by B.F. in the *Pennsylvania Gazette* of July 26, 1739 for 2s. The oldest printing of Pennsylvania's laws are from 1730. Benjamin Franklin and his partner Hugh Meridith were appointed printers to the Pennsylvania Assembly, January 29, 1730. Of his many achievements, Franklin was proudest of being a printer. Included in this volume is "An Act for the more effectual preserving the Credit of our Paper Money and recovering the Proprietary Quit-Rents."

The last complete edition of Pennsylvania laws had been printed in 1728 by Andrew Bradford, and the need for a corrected edition led to the appointment in 1739 of Kinsey, Speaker of the Assembly and Attorney General of the Province, to prepare a new edition. Kinsey completed a revised edition in 1741 and turned it over to Franklin, who required two years to complete the job. He finished presswork for the volume in the spring of 1743, the year after the date of imprint. One of the most extensive and important of early Franklin imprints. (*George S. MacManus Company*)

The Chancery Bill set forth the claims for jurisdiction over the Elizabeth-town land grants by the Council of Proprietors of East New Jersey. Its publication was by private subscription ... and work on the volume was begun late January 1746. It was [Benjamin] Franklin's suggestion that the Council commission Lewis Evans of Philadelphia to draw the maps and James Turner of Boston to engrave and print them. This edition of the Laws of the Assembly of the Lower Counties is significant for its inclusiveness; it contains 129 laws, or more than twice the number found in the 1st edition of 1741 which Franklin had printed. This compilation was the work of Benjamin Chew, who became Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. Because the Assembly of the lower counties was far less regular in ordering the publication of its acts than the Pennsylvania Assembly, Chew found it necessary to list all repealed laws since 1700 and to endorse personally 51 laws which had not been previously printed.
